Application Procedure for Scholarships for Entering Freshmen

The [LSU Application for Undergraduate Admission](#) is the automatic application for entering freshmen scholarships. This application must be submitted along with an official high school transcript, standardized test scores, and all other required information.

The priority date for full consideration for all programs is November 15.

Notification of scholarship recipients normally begins in November and continues through March. Students are considered based on a six-semester transcript once they have been admitted to the university. To be guaranteed consideration, **standardized test scores must be received by November 15.**

Chancellor's Alumni Scholarships

These scholarships, funded through endowments made to the University by Gordon A. Cain and Fred H. Fenn, are LSU's most prestigious awards.

Qualifications:

To be considered, candidates must have either a Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) score of at least 1460 or an American College Test (ACT) composite score of at least 33, as well as a 3.5 computed grade point average. Students meeting these credentials are required to submit an essay online with their admission application to be considered for this program.

Award:

Recipients will choose either:

A cash award of \$12,000 (\$3,000 per year)

Or

A cash award of \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year) and a room & board scholarship valued at approximately \$24,328 (\$6,082 per year). The room & board scholarship covers the cost of a two-student room and the Resident Tiger meal plan.

- Recipients also receive an opportunity to earn an additional \$6,200 (\$1,550 per year) through participation in the Chancellor's Future Leaders in Research program. Through this program students are assigned to work with individual faculty members engaged in research projects. The student may choose the Chancellor's Student Aide position in lieu of the research program.
- Nonresident students receiving this award are eligible to receive a [Golden Oaks](#) award which covers tuition and the nonresident fee.

Golden Oaks Awards

Qualifications:

- Nonresident students selected as recipients of Chancellor's Alumni, LSU Alumni Association (Top 100), or LSU Distinguished Freshman Awards are eligible to receive this award.
- Nonresident National Merit Semifinalists are eligible to receive this award.
- Nonresident students who have a 1320 SAT or 30 ACT and a 3.0 computed grade point average are eligible for consideration.

Award:

- Exemption from the payment of tuition and nonresident fees.
- An opportunity to become a Chancellor's Student Aide and earn up to \$6,200 (\$1,550 per year) working in a campus job.

Tiger Scholars

Qualifications:

- Nonresident students with at least an 1170 SAT or 26 ACT score and a 3.0 computed grade point average are eligible for consideration.

Award:

- The award will be applied to nonresident fees. Amounts vary based on academic credentials and standardized test scores.

Legacy Scholarship

Bengal Legacy Scholarships

Recipients of these awards receive an exemption from seventy-five percent of the nonresident fee. To qualify, an applicant must be classified as a nonresident undergraduate student (no previous degree), must be the natural or adopted child of a graduate of any LSU System school, and must qualify for admission to the University.

Chancellor's Leadership Scholarship

Qualifications: Based on leadership activities in high school and community

Award: \$1,000 for one year

LSU Alumni Association (Top 100) Scholarship

– One outstanding student is designated from the DFW area

Qualifications:

Any student with a 1460 SAT or a 33 ACT as well as a 3.5 academic GPA who applies for the Chancellor's Alumni Scholarship is eligible to receive this award. Any student with a 1410 SAT or a 32 ACT as well as an excellent high school record may be considered

Award:

- Cash award \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year)
- An opportunity to participate in either the Chancellor's Future Leaders in Research program or to become a Chancellor's student aide and earn up to \$6,200 (1,550 per year) working in a campus job.

Apply: Apply to the Chancellor's Alumni Scholarship by November 15th. The scholarship office will evaluate and award this scholarship on behalf of the DFW Alumni Association.
